

# If you believe in climate change, you should be worried about the San Francisco Bay Delta.

Most of California's water flows through the Delta, fueling our huge agricultural engine, serving 20+ million residents in Southern California and enabling critical manufacturing functions in our high tech corridors.

The Delta – and its delicate ecosystem – is also standing directly in the path of climate change. The declining Sierra snowpack means less fresh water coming down from the Sierras, and sea level rise means increasing salt water incursions from the West. Coupled with the ever present earthquake risk to the 1100 miles of levees, overall water supply, reliability and water quality are all at risk.
